□ 3. PROJECT SUMMARY: Description of Project and Contemplated Agency Benefits.

Hearing Officer: The proposed project will be located at 250 Delaware Avenue, City of Buffalo, Erie County, New York (the "Land") consisting of: (i) the appointment of the Company as

agent of the Agency to undertake the planning, design, construction, and equipping of 109,345+/- SF of class "A" office space (the "Improvements") and (ii) the acquisition and installation by the Company of certain items of machinery, equipment and other tangible personal property (the "Equipment" and, collectively with the Land and Improvements, the "Facility").

The proposed financial assistance contemplated by the Agency includes sales and use tax exemption benefits (in compliance with Agency's uniform tax exemption policy).

Dan Zimmer - Vice President, Delaware North Companies - Delaware North Companies is a family owned business that's approaching its 100th anniversary in 2015 that is also the year that our lease at Key Center expires. Delaware North recently submitted a application for assistance from the ECIDA through one of ECIDA's programs to obtain sales tax abatement on the investment Delaware North will be making to build out its 109,000 sq. ft. of office space inside Uniland's proposed building at 250 Delaware Avenue. Delaware North is looking to be a tenant in the building. Delaware North is seeking assistance covering the floors it will be occupying in the building and the Jacobs family that owns Delaware North wants to keep its world headquarters in downtown Buffalo. It has grown its business here and feels a sense of loyalty to its hometown. Delaware North is looking to create a true world headquarters facility in downtown Buffalo that the City, County and State would be proud of, as well as committing to keeping its future growth here. I would be happy to address any questions or comments.

Ellen Kennedy - Resident, City of Buffalo - I just really question how the ECIDA could justify giving tax breaks to Delaware North. According to their website has 200 locations across three continents and had 2.6 billion dollars in annual revenue. Tax breaks to move to a new office space, it would seem the company could easily afford this move without any public support. Jeremy Jacobs and his family have been outstanding citizens in our community, generous philanthropists both personally and through Delaware North. I can't believe they would move their headquarters just because they do not receive tax breaks for new office space. Such a move would seem to violate their company values. Some quotes from their website include; "approach business in a sociable responsible manner" "a family tradition of integrity, accountability & commitment to always do the right thing" "carefully consider the consequences of our decisions and actions". I strongly oppose approving this application.
